Eva Pernell Britt (74), a native of Hertford County, died Monday December 3, 2018 at her home in Washington, D.C. Eva received her undergraduate degree in Art from Elizabeth City State University in Elizabeth City, N.C. and went on to obtain her law degree from the Howard University Law School in Washington, D.C. Eva passed the D.C. Bar Exam and was a practicing attorney in Washington specializing in probate law and disability law until her death.

Eva was the oldest of seven children born to the late Maude and John Clayton Britt III and is survived by a brother, John Clayton Britt IV of California, and three sisters Alice Mae Britt of Texas, Marva Loretta Harmon and Goldie Ann Manley both of Maryland. Eva was preceded in death by two brothers, James Earl Britt and Michael Steven Britt, Sr.

She took her motorized chair to our offices, to court, perhaps to fashion shows, wherever she needed to go. In our mailroom, Eva dismounted, used canes and penguin-like walking to get to and from her mailbox. Sometimes she tarried to chat a bit. I can hardly bring to mind her face without its smile. Her conversation was consistently cheerful, uplifting. When she left, a light had gone.

Eva worked worked with and for disabled people. Did some teaching. Originated and probably sold fashion items for disabled, and abled, women. She had a good eye for clothes. I was, also, confident of her competence in legal tasks which she undertook.

We kept a mail service account for Eva for decades. We honored the host/client relationship. We charged her little and she paid when she wanted to. She was Eva Britt, attorney at law.

Our reward was her presence. The sight and sound of Eva on our premises uplifted the day, or the month, she appeared. We were better on that day. She was courage, the joy of life, vibrant among us.

Told I cannot see her again, that is what I miss now, I do not know if I will ever again meet her match.
