She liked to cheer for the Baltimore Ravens to include the wearing of paraphernalia. Sometimes she did not know the game had ended or she was on the wrong channel. It is hoped that there is BINGO in heaven because she loved to play and was in it to win it. She was a lifelong learner and took advantage of any opportunity to learn something new.

Julie Faye was very active in her community. She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, was President of the PTA, campaigned for local politicians; mentor for the 4H Club, Girl Scouts and Home Demonstration Club. Several gospel and singing groups were formed with her guidance. While in Baltimore, she crocheted hat and bootie sets to donate to infants that would otherwise have left the hospital with nothing. She was always a cheerful giver. If you needed advice, a ride, someone to listen or a hug her arms were always open.
