



## William "Billy" Carter Jr.

February 10, 1933 - December 2, 2019

William Henry Carter, Jr. (86) was born on February 10, 1933 in Williamston, NC to William Henry Carter, Sr. and Inez Myrtle Mountain Carter. "Bill"/ "Billy" as he was affectionately called by family and friends, lost his parents at a young age and was raised by his maternal grandparents, John H. Mountain, Sr. and Georgia Weaver Mountain. Bill's early education was received at Robert L. Vann School in Ahoskie, NC. After graduation, Bill enlisted in the US Army in 1952 and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant in 1955. During his active duty he served in the Korean War. He was awarded with several service medals during his enlistment; Combat Infantry, National Défense Service Medal, Korean Service Medal, Commendation Ribbon w/Metal Pendant and a Good Conduct Medal. After being honorably discharged Bill decided to continued his service to his country by joining the Army Reserve, where he served until December 1963. After serving, Bill took courses at Kansas State, North Carolina A&T, and Columbia University with a concentration in Mathematics.

Coming from a family of talented carpenters, Bill inherited this gift as well. He spent countless hours of his adult life constructing and beautifying others homes and businesses.

Left to cherish his memories are his children, Inez Carter, Anthony Carter (Debbie), Michael Carter (Andrea), Lisa Reid (Mark), Nita Carter and Levi Carter; grandchildren, Ian Braithwaite, Natasha Carter, Issa Braithwaite, Victoria Carter, Christopher Carter, Myles Reid, Blake Reid and Michaela
